



From Pastor Ron's Desk

Hot, Hot, Hot. As I write this article, we find ourselves amid a string of days of 100 plus degrees. At the same time, the well at my house is beginning to show signs that the water supply is strained and not able to keep up. The drought last year has really impacted the ground water supply which got me to thinking about gratitude. Often around this time of year some of our air conditions fail, or we lose some resource like sufficient water, or sufficient funds or maybe we are struggling with some health issues. Yet often our first response to these struggles is to complain. And yet if these struggles get resolved we then, and only then give thanks. We become so accustomed to comforts that they begin to be rights and we get upset when they are gone, but that doesn't please the Lord. Rather, we need to cultivate gratitude for everything we have realizing that it is a blessing and favor of the Lord. In the United States and Japan, 90% of households have AC, yet in Mexico and Brazil only 16% have AC and in India and South Africa only 5% and 6% have AC respectively.

As the people of God, we should be the most grateful people on the planet and yet it seems the more we have the more we complain. While on the mission trip in Ensenada, Mexico many years ago, I was impressed by the joy in simplicity of the believers there. They had very little, certainly not AC, and yet they worshipped and praised the Lord with full, vibrant, and grateful hearts. Spend some time in these Hot, Hot, Hot days to give Thanks, Thanks, Thanks.
